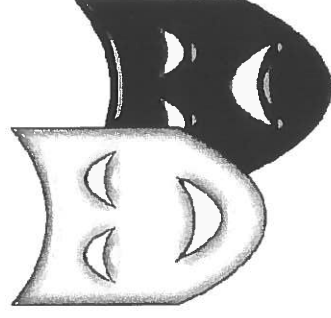


But we need your help!

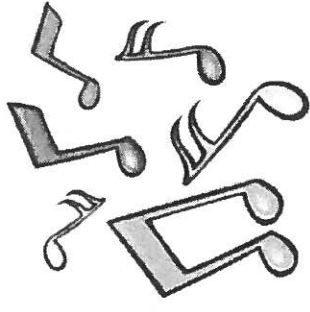
We watch all this fabulous talent up on stage today, but we know where it really comes from:

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

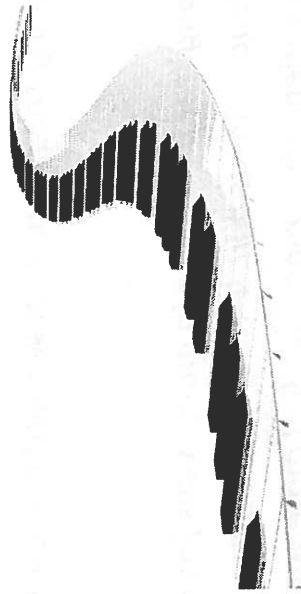
